

Southwest Side Road Projects Underway

Hadley-Moon Road Roundabout--The improvements will stretch south on Moon Road to the new Guilford Elementary School, including a new roundabout at the intersection of Hadley & Moon. Drivers can expect to see lane restrictions and flagging initially, but shortly after Easter, the project will be converted to accommodate one-way travel only. Vehicles will be allowed to continue west on Hadley Road, and will have the option of traveling either north or south on Moon Road. All other directions of travel will be required to detour around the site during that time.

The Town will provide additional and more detailed information as the project progresses that will help drivers be prepared for the travel restrictions that are necessary to complete the construction.

CR 675 East (Hall Road) Reconstruction--Back in 2017, the Town approved a request for annexation of property south of Hadley Road along CR 675 E. By agreeing to annex, the Town accepted jurisdiction over the adjacent roadway. Hall Road is currently closed for reconstruction and widening to meet Town Standards. Detour signs direct traffic to use CR 725 E as an alternative. Most of the local traffic will be required to access property from the south as the project includes a new culvert installation that will make the road impassable for several months. Subject to accommodating weather, the project is being targeted to re-open ahead of the Hadley-Moon full intersection closure, though drivers should be prepared for restrictions occurring on both projects through the first half of the construction season.

Corridor Study

The Town and Hendricks County are preparing to take the next steps in planning for a future roadway corridor that would connect I-70 to US 40 somewhere between Quaker Boulevard (formerly SR 267) & SR 39. A future interchange with I-70 was originally considered as part of the Town of Plainfield's 2004 Comprehensive Plan, and this current study continues to build upon the long-term planning that is necessary for such a significant and impactful decision for the Community.

The Town has hired a consultant, Crawford, Murphey & Tilley (CMT) to develop a plan and provide a recommendation on a preferred route. The recommendation is based upon important factors expressed by the Community while also considering the regional transportation impacts and planning that will be of interest to local, state and federal transportation officials.



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It is important to iterate that this plan is a local plan and is not being done with participation from federal and state officials as part of an actual project. CMT plans to produce a draft of the final plan by April 5th and will post the plan online and allow for public review and comment. A public meeting will be held the week of April 12th. Format and location details will be publicized shortly beforehand as we take proper safety precautions, though in-person and virtual options are being planned. SR 267 AGREEMENT

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) recently entered into an agreement with the Town of Plainfield and Hendricks County regarding the relinquishment of a portion of State Road 267, known locally as Quaker Boulevard. Avon Avenue north of US 40 was also included as part of the agreement. The effective date of the transfer officially occurs on April 1st. The Town of Plainfield will now oversee the snowplowing, pavement repairs, mowing, debris removal and traffic signal timing, to name a few of the new responsibilities. In return the Town will receive approximately \$20.5 million for local project improvements.

The Department of Public Works' Spring Heavy Trash Days will be held on April 17, and April 24, from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Plainfield residents may bring acceptable heavy trash items to the designated dumpsters at the Town garage located at 986 S. Center Street. Items accepted include just about everything except hazardous waste, tires, building materials, or yard waste. This also includes furniture, although residents who bring mattresses will have to handle getting the mattresses out of their vehicle and into the dumpster on their own. For sanitary reasons, DPW staff will not handle such items. Residents should remove gas and oil from mowers and leaf blowers.
