ROAD PROJECTS: STAFFORD AND CAMBY ROADS

Stafford Road-The Town recently restarted a project to make stormwater system improvements along Stafford Road, near the intersection with Simmons Street. The final portion of the project requires a temporary closure of Stafford Road, from just east of the Plainfield Middle School to east of Walton Drive, as a new truckline is installed underneath the roadway. The closure began on Wednesday, May 26th and will re-open ahead of the 2021-2022 school calendar. During the closure, access to the Plainfield-Guildford Township Library will continue to be accessible from Simmons Street, but drivers will need to route around to access properties to the north of Stafford.

Camby Road and Quaker Boulevard-In May, the Town approved a contract with Rieth-Riley Construction Company to improve the intersection of Quaker Boulevard and Camby Road. This first intersection south of I-70 has experienced increasing traffic volumes since 2011. The intersection will be expanded for capacity and a traffic signal will be installed to improve efficiency for the Camby Road approaches. This project will be constructed in 3-phases to allow for continued use of the intersection, though restrictions to available turn lanes are expected to create increased congestion during construction. With the nearby INDOT restrictions occurring at I-70 during the same time, drivers are encouraged to consider alternative routes to reduce delays.
